



Risk Assessment for schools – Fort Grey.

This is intended to be a guide only and teachers are strongly recommended to visit the site and conduct their own assessments, based on their students.

Method: Staff Inspection and feedback

Hazards:

1. Main stairwell – poor light under certain weather conditions and around dusk.
2. Lower steps – lack of handrails
3. Causeway – uneven surface and prone to flooding on high spring tides and/or with high seas.
4. Openings in outer wall – possible to climb / fall through.

Groups at Risk:

1. Senior citizens and the partially sighted at medium risk, all others at low risk.
2. Senior citizens, people with mobility problems at medium risk.
3. Senior citizens, people with mobility problems at low risk.
4. Senior citizens, people with mobility problems.
5. Young children and toddlers at medium risk
6. Young children and toddlers at medium risk

Action Taken:

- School groups are advised to check the tides when booking and asked to bring appropriate numbers of supervisory staff (check with us about ratios).
- School groups are advised to warn the children beforehand about uneven surfaces and not climbing walls.
- One member of staff is on duty at the Fort during normal opening hours. They are trained in First Aid and evacuation procedures. A member of the Learning team can host a school group if requested beforehand.
