THE WAR IS OVER FOR GUERNSEY

German Officers Inform Bailiff of Surrender

HISTORIC STATES MEETING AT MID-DAY TO-DAY

AT 10-30 THIS MORNING "THE STAR" WAS OFFICIALLY INFORMED BY MR. LOUIS GUILLEMETTE, SECRETARY TO JURAT JOHN LEALE, [PRESIDENT TO THE CONTROLLING COMMITTEE OF THE STATES OF GUERNSEY] THAT THE WAR HAS, SO FAR AS GUERNSEY WAS CONCERNED, HAD ENDED.

PEOPLE OF GUERNSEY CAN TO-DAY AT 3 O'CLOCK, IF THEY ARE ABLE TO DO SO, LISTEN TO THE SPEECH MADE OVER THE BRITISH RADIO BY PRIME MINISTER WINSTON CHURCHILL. IMMEDIATELY AFTER THAT HOUR FLAGS CAN BE FLOWN IN GUERNSEY AS A SIGN OF REJOICING.

At 10 a.m. to-day Korvetten Kapitän Reich and Baron von Aufsess called on the Bailiff of Guernsey at his Chambers at the Royal Court House. Jurat John Leale, President of the Controlling Committee and his Secretary, Mr. Louis Guillemette, were also present. Kapitän Reich said that the war was over in the Channel Islands as well as elsewhere. He said that Mr. Churchill, the British Prime Minister, was making a speech at 3 o'clock this afternoon and that the German authorities had no objection to the hoisting of flags after the speech:

On the receipt of this news the Bailiff convened an extra-special States Meeting to be held at mid-day to-day where the full details of this momentous news was conveyed to members of the States.
