## **Welcome to Fort Grey Shipwreck Museum**

The history details...

- Fort Grey was built in 1804 to help defend Guernsey against the French. It is one of a chain of forts built along the coast.
- It actually stands on the site of a much earlier tower, known as Chateau de Rocquaine. The Germans took advantage of Fort Grey's position and used it as an anti-aircraft battery during WW2. It was transformed into a shipwreck museum and opened in 1976.
