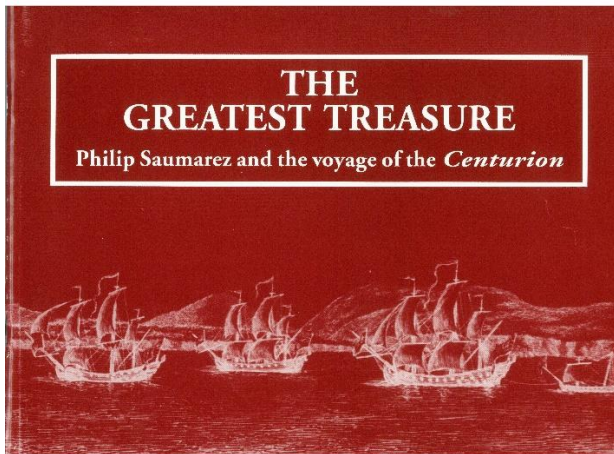

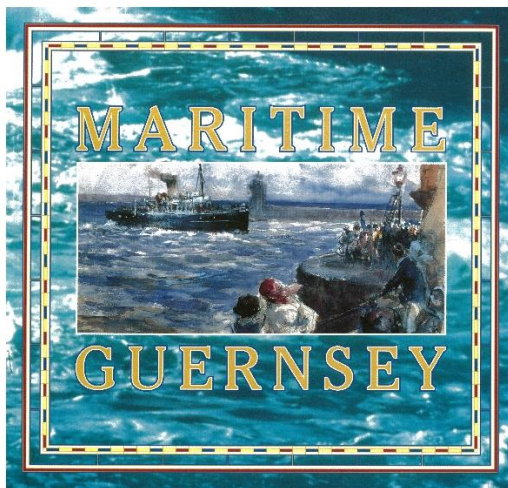

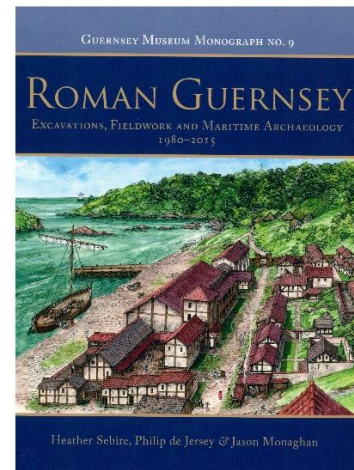

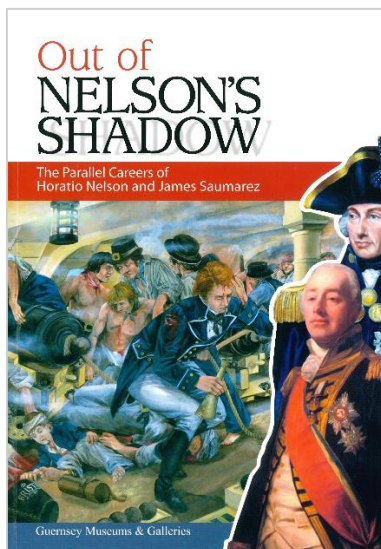
The archaeological excavation was undertaken by Dr Margaret Rule CBE, internationally known for her work on Henry VIII's warship the Mary Rose.
