The several persons whose names are hereto subscribed, and whose descriptions are contained below, and of whom twelve are engaged as sailors, hereby agree to serve on board the said ship, in the several capacities expressed against their respective names, on a voyage from London to Punta Arenas and any other places on the West Coasts of Central South and North America, including California and Oregon, North and South Pacific and Atlantic Oceans, Cape and Australian Colonies, New Zealand and Japan, Indian and China Seas and the Continent of Europe including the Mediterranean to and fro for any period not exceeding eighteen months and back to the port of final discharge in the United Kingdom.

Provisions issued as per the 'America' voyage, 1863-64.

When butter is issued the allowance of meat will be ½ lb less per man daily. No spirits allowed. Equivalent may be issued at the Master's option. If any person is not on board at the time appointed the master may engage a substitute at once. The vessel shall be considered fully manned with eighteen hands all told. Swearing strictly prohibited.
