I hereby certify that the master has reported to me that the within named Auguste Briere OS committed a most unwarrantable assault upon the first mate Willm. T Brehaut on the 16<sup>th</sup> instant, rushing on him and striking him a violent blow on the head and knocked him down on the gun, without any other provocation than being told that he did not wish two men to the tallying the cargo at one time; that the mate presented himself at this office and that I found his head much bruised and his eye blackened, and he complained much of the pain in his head and side by reason of being struck down on the gun, and had been for two days scarcely able to do his duty; and that the master furthermore reported to me that on the 14<sup>th</sup> instant he had charged the said Auguste Briere with drunken and disorderly conduct, both of which charges have been duly entered in the Official Log book and which has been presented to me.
