Nov 6 <sup>th</sup> at 5 p.m.	Lat. 49 N Long 6 W	William Venville, apprentice, was sent with another boy to fasten main royal, when on the yard he lost his hold and fell on deck, when pick up found left knee out of place and left eye cut very bad, wash blood off his face, & put two stitch of sewing to close the cut, place lint on with Friars Balsam and bandage. Put splints on his leg with bandages then strap both legs out short, one man to wet his head all night, gave him weak brandy and water, at midnight fifteen drops of laudanum. Nov 7 <sup>th</sup> 68	Lat 46 16 N Long 10.20 W	William Venville apprentice as well has can be expected we have wash his face & dress his eye again gave him hartsroat at 11 am. Gave him small amounts of castor oil. H G Le Lacheur Master Robert Rogers Boatswain	
Nov. 8 <sup>th</sup> 68	Lat 44.38 N Long 12.23 W	William Venville apprentice doing well no fever gave him toast water to drink. Hartsroat twice per day nothing more can be done to him but endeaver to keep fever off. H G Le Lacheur Master	

Nov. 10 <sup>th</sup> 68	Lat 41.26 N Long 15. W	William Verville is about the same we have dress his eye & cut again and readjusted the splints on his leg. We keep him on low diet. H G Le Lacheur Master William Domaille Mate Robert Rogers Boatswain	
	Lat 58 N Long 15.30 W	William Venville apprentice we have dress his cuts over his eye and find it looking well, he has no fever, but still keep him on low diet. H G Le Lacheur Master Robert Rogers Boatswain	
Dec 9 <sup>th</sup> 68	Lat. 21 S Long 36. W	William Venville apprentice has recovered his eye sight and cut on the same is quite heal up. We got bandages off his leg but find he cannot use it, we have put the splints and bandages on again, for the last ten days we have given him essence of beef. Monday Jan 4 <sup>th</sup> 69	Lat 40.50 N Long 78 West	William Venville apprentice on this day we have got bandages off his leg and splints. I find he will have a slight bend in the knee already perseptable. We have been giving him port wine, fresh beef and essence of beef tea in order to try and give him strength. In a few days from this he will be able to walk. H G Le Lacheur Master. Robert Rogers Boatswain	
Jan 22 <sup>nd</sup> 69	Lat 4 .10 Long 85 W	William Venville apprentice able to work on crutches we find that his hip bone out of place. Expect to be in port in a few days when a doctor will be call on to see the boy. H G Le Lacheur	
Jan 28 <sup>th</sup> 69	Ship arrive at Punta arenas	The only doctor in this port is sick with fever. Three days after doctor is dead. H G Le Lacheur	
Feb 8 <sup>th</sup> 69	Ship in port	A doctor has come to the port. Boy Venville taken on shore to the hospital. Doctor cannot replace the boys hip bone and has given me a letter to that effect. H G Le Lacheur Master William Domaille Mate Robert Rogers Boatswain
