#	House	Name	Approx. date	More info
1 (oldest)	d	Neolithic settlement	5000 BC to about 2000 BC	An artist's impression of a Neolithic settlement in the valley of St. Peter Port, Guernsey.
2	j	Roman settlement	250 AD	Roman St. Peter Port with the Gallo-Roman ship by the quayside and an Iron Age settlement (of roundhouses) in the background. Compare the thatched roofs of the roundhouses with the tiled Roman buildings.
3	a	Saints Farm	1150	This house was started in the 1100s but has changed a lot and now looks post-medieval.
4	f	The Elms (Pleinheume)	1250	This house was started in the 1200s and still looks Medieval.
5	g	Sutler's House	1500s	A good example of a Tudor house. This house is within Castle Cornet.
6	c	Les Granges de Beauvoir	1600s	Built in 1603 and still has many original features.
7	h	Constables Office	1700s	Georgian house; built in 1787 by William Le Marchant.
8	i	New Place	1800s	Early Victorian house; built in 1836. This is in Rouvets, St Sampsons.
9	e	Per Ardua	1900s	Bungalow in St Martins, built in 1950.
10 (newest)	b	The Glade	2000s	Built c. 2018.
