
A Victorian Trail around St Peter Port.

Statue of Victor Hugo

The statue includes the year of Hugo's birth. He came to Guernsey in 1855. How old was he when he arrived?

53 years old (he was born in 1802)

Candie House

This was once a private house belonging to Osmond de Beauvoir Priaulx. He donated his house and gardens to the people of Guernsey in 1871.

It is now a public library called the Priaulx Library.

Candie Cemetery

Frederick Corbin Lukis lived during Victorian Times. He was an archaeologist and his work formed the basis of Guernsey Museum. The Lukis Family tomb is in Candie Cemetery. If you find the tomb, record when he died.

Statue of Prince Albert

Did you know? Queen Victoria and Prince Albert visited Guernsey in 1846. They were only here for a short time and had a quick tour of St Peter Port. Some roads were named after them; they travelled along Victoria Road, Queen's Road and Prince Albert Road.

Hauteville House
