JAMES ST. VINCENT DE SAUMAREZ


AND THE DIPLONATIC SERVICE

James St. Vincent De Saumarez was born in July 1843. He was the 4th Baron de Saumarez and grandson of Admiral Lord de Saumarez. He joined the Grenadier Guards and reached the rank of Captain. In 1867 he joined the British Diplomatic Service and was promoted to the position of Second Secretary in November 1874. In this position he was permitted to serve in any of the British Embassies or Legations abroad.

Over his eighteen year career he mostly served in various British embassies across Europe.

However in 1876 he was sent to work at the British Embassy in Tokyo and his time in Japan left an indelible impression on him.

James remained in Japan until 1879 at which point he left and travelled into China for two months. He then remained serving in the British Diplomatic Service at the Embassies in Rome and then Brussels. He retired in 1885 and returned to Guernsey to focus on developing and running the family estate.
